Greensky Bluegrass

We're not sure when grizzled, moonshine-swilling Appalachian types passed the bluegrass baton on to pot-smokin' hippies. It probably happened sometime in the 1960s or '70s, when progressive bluegrass emerged from the muck of musical fusion. The new bluegrass artists aren't afraid to integrate electric instruments or elements of other genres. In the case of Greensky Bluegrass, they tweak the traditional American music genre by slowing it down. They're sort of the DJ Screw of southern folk music, creating a slowed and throwed version of bluegrass that's long on the laid-back slow jam. To see how it differs from traditional bluegrass, pull out your old wax cylinders and observe the pace of all that grain alcohol-fueled fiddling. Greensky Bluegrass are much more suitable for relaxing and enjoying a beer, which always tastes better accompanied by banjos and mandolins. **Amy Kingsley, akingsley@lvcitylife.com**

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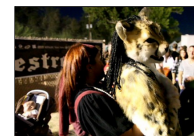
